The Peace of God

Therefore, my brothers and sisters, you whom I love and long for, my joy and crown, stand firm in the Lord in this way, dear friends

⁴Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! ⁵Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near. ⁶Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. ⁷And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. ⁸Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things. ⁹Whatever you have learned or received or heard from me, or seen in me—put it into practice. And the God of peace will be with you. (Philippians 4:1-9)

PEACE: IT'S CHARACTER

- A. Paul promises the Peace of God to those who rejoice and pray
 - 1. This peace is not a military peace
- 2. This peace is not a relational peace
- 3. This peace is not a doctrinal peace; every believer has peace with God
 - a. In Romans 5:12, Paul writes about "Peace with God"
 - b. In Philippians 4, Paul is writing about the "Peace of God"
- B. The Peace of God is an inner gift of God's grace
 - 1. This "peace" is an infusion of divine strength
 - 2. This "peace" is inclusive; it keeps our hearts, minds, will and strength focused on Jesus
 - 3. This "peace" is being in an intimate, inseparable relationship with Jesus
- 4. This "peace" is enjoyed only by people who keep the Lord near (cf. 4:5)

PEACE: ITS CONTENT

- A. Through the first window, we see peace as calm in the midst of turmoil
- 1. As Paul wrote these words he was confined to a Roman prison
- 2. As we endure troubles or storms we can still be embraced the Peace of God

- 3. My prayer: that you know this peace in your storms and challenges
- B. Through the second window, we're assured of God's presence in our world
 - 1. This is a peace of Jesus God with us wrapped around us all the time
 - 2. This is a peace where God holds and cares for us in the palm of his hand

"Sometimes it seems God's gone away; forgetting the promises we heard him say; And we're lost out there in the stars!" (Maxwell Anderson)

"The eternal God is your dwelling place, and underneath are the everlasting arms."

- 3. My prayer: that you know God's presence even when life doesn't make sense
- C. The third window, we'll call the future: "The peace of God will keep you"
 - 1. This promise is a forever promise to help us face each new day
- 2. The future belongs to God. We belong to God. The promise is guaranteed!
- 3. My prayer: that you step confidently into the future knowing God is there
- D. None of these windows really explain this "Peace of God"
 - 1. "It is a peace that passes all understanding"
 - 2. Nothing can challenge our eternal security, his divine companionship, or the confident hope we have in Jesus

PEACE: IT'S CONTEXT

- A. This indescribable peace is illustrated in the context
 - 1. 4:1 People who have this peace "stand firm in the Lord!"
 - 2. 4:2 People who have this peace "agree in the Lord"
 - 3. 4:4 People who have this peace know how to "rejoice!"
 - 4. 4:5 People who have this peace are forbearing, patient, and gentle
 - 5. 4:6 People who have this peace have minimal anxiety
- B. People who have this peace expect Christ to return: the best is yet to come
 - 1. 4:6 They pray so they can stay close to God
 - 2. 4:6 They practice gratitude so they worship and give thanks
 - 3. 4:8 They focus on things that are true, right, pure, lovely and praiseworthy
- C. This peace is not available apart from Jesus
 - 1. We're not saying, Goodbye. We're saying, "Fare well!"
- 2. May the God of Peace and the Peace of God be with you!
